Sub : Ship Breaking activity in Mumbai Port.

Ref : This office circular No. TM/B/10-15/39 of
86-87 dated 13th March, 2009.

In continuation to this office circular dated 13.03.09, it is to inform that Maharashtra Pollution Control Board (MPCB) vide their letter dated 16.03.09 has requested Mumbai Port Trust to allocate plot for ship breaking only after producing 'No Objection Certificate' from them.

2. All ship breakers should, therefore, obtain 'No Objection Certificate' from MPCB and submit the same alongwith the application for beaching. This is in addition to certificate stating that the ship has been properly decontaminated.
3. Also an undertaking is required from the ship breaker to abide by the procedures and conditions stipulated in this office circular dated 13.03.09.
4. In view of the above, Annexures 'A' & 'B' to the circular dated 13.03.09 have been

revised and are enclosed herewith.

5. Kindly note that the applications for beaching and breaking of ships will be accepted only when accompanied with documents specified in revised Annexure 'A' and Annexure 'B'.

Annexure A (24.03.2009)

List of documents required for obtaining Beaching permission

- (1) Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) issued by the buyers and sellers.
- (2) Vessel Survey/Port Worthiness Certificate issued by surveyors.
- (3) Light Displacement Tonnage Certificate by surveyors.
- (4) Physical Delivery Certificate issued by the Agent and Master of vessel.
- (5) **Undertaking** in the prescribed format
- (6) Gas Free Certificate issued by Inspector of Explosives for Hot work (For all tanker vessels prior to beaching and for other vessels prior to breaking)
- (7) Customs NOC for beaching.
- (8) Custom Noted Bill of Entry.
- (9) Ship Registry/Tonnage Certificate
- (10) Authorization letter issued by the Maharashtra Pollution Control Board (MPCB)
- (11) No Objection Certificate from Maharashtra Pollution Control Board (MPCB) for allotment of ship breaking plot

Annexure B (24.03.2009)List of documents required for obtaining Ship-breaking permission

- (1) Bill of Sale
- (2) Commercial Invoice issued by the Seller
- (3) Payment receipt of Port department's charges
- (4) Bill of Entry duly endorsed by the Customs as "Passed out of Customs charges"
- (5) NOC/Permission to break the vessel for home consumption issued by the Customs.
- (6) NOC by the Director, Pollution Control Cell, MbPT.
- (7) Confirmation of LDT of the vessel by Dy. Conservator, MbPT.
- (8) MPCB Certificate for ship has been properly decontaminated by removing hazardous material.
- (9) Inventory of Hazardous material on board the vessel issued by the Master of the vessel.
- (10) Gas Free Certificate for Hot work issued by Inspector of Explosives.
- (11) Breaking Plan.
- (12) Deposit receipt of 90 days ship breaking charges.
