LEVY OF CONCESSIONAL CHARGES FOR STORAGE OF EMPTY **CONTAINERS AT DESIGNATED YARDS OF MUMBAI PORT**

Sub: Levy of concessional charges for Storage of Emp at designated yards of Mumbai Port.

In view of the need for storage of empty containers at a competitive rate, it has been decided to levy concessional charges for storage of empty containers at Golden Yard, Wadala and other CFSs effective from 11th September, 2006. The following are the details of the concessional charges:

For exclusive storage of empty containers, one of the areas identified is at (i)

- Golden Yard Wadala, where the concessional charges will be Rs. 10 per TEU per day or part thereof, from the date of receipt of container in the yard till date of removal.
- (ii) At Other CFS areas: As against the existing rate of US \$ 2.5 per TEU per day or part thereof from the date of destuffing of import loaded containers (i.e FCLs and LCLs) till removal/stuffing, the charges will be US\$ 2.5 per TEU per day or part thereof for the 3 days from the date of destuffing of import loaded container and thereafter at concessional rate of US\$ 0.5 per TEU per day or part thereof from the 4th day from the date of destuffing till date of removal or stuffing of container.
- 2. These concessional rates will be effective from 11th September 2006 and will be initially valid for **six months** and reviewed before completion of the six months term. This concessional rate shall not apply for containers handled in Docks proper.
- 3. You are requested to give wide publicity amongst your members of the aforesaid facilities offered at concessional rate for storage of empty containers and handle more containers through Mumbai Port.
