			(d) In case of Customs orders for destruction, the cargo will be destroyed accordingly and destruction charges will be recovered accordingly.	

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			(vi) Importer had cleared the Pigeon peas consignment on payment of Port charges of Rs.12.23 crore including GST on demurrage, considering double VCD as insisted by Port. The amount available with Port excluding GST is Rs.10,41,52,152/-(Rs.31,67,143/- storage + Rs.10,09,85,009/- as demurrage).	
			(vii) GST is already paid (Rs.1,81,77,302/-) and Port has already remitted GST on amount recovered for demurrage on Pigeon peas. The GST will be required to be borne by the Importer. No refund on account of GST will be given.

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			(x) The importer shall not file any litigation (except for petition of appeal/review/concilia tion) against MbPA for the said transaction. An undertaking to this effect, will be required to be submitted by Importer, alongwith confirmation in terms of (iv) above.
