**STORAGE FACILITIES FOR IMPORT BAGGED CARGOES LIKE PULSES, ETC. IN  
INDIRA DOCK FOR A PERIOD UPTO 90 DAYS**

Sirs,

Sub: Storage facilities for import bagged cargoes like pulses, etc. in Indira Dock for a period upto 90 days.

Ref: This office circular No.TM/D/4-3/19 of 1996-97 dated 05.09.2008.

*Vide* above referred circular, the trade was informed that import bagged cargo like pulses etc shall be permitted on long term storage in the notified areas upto a maximum period of 180 days from the date of initial allotment on recovery of licence (storage) fees as per the rates specified in Section 3.3(A)(II) of Chapter III of the Scale of Rates.

2. Pursuant to representations received and due to paucity of space in the outlying areas, it has now been decided to notify covered areas in Indira Dock at 5 ID temporary shed, 20 ID first floor and 21 ID first floor as nominated areas for storage of import bagged cargoes like pulses etc up to a maximum period of 90 days on recovery of licence (storage) fees as per the rates specified in Section 3.3(A)(II) of Chapter III of the Scale of Rates as below:

Location	Period Of Storage	Rate Per Sq Mtr or Part thereof per month or part thereof (In Rs)
a) 5 ID Temporary Shed	First 30 days or part thereof	40.00
b) 20 ID First Floor	31 <sup>st</sup> day to 90 <sup>th</sup> day	80.00
c) 21 ID First Floor		

In the event of non-clearance of consignment within the period upto 90 days, demurrage shall be recovered at the rates specified in Section 3.1(B) of Chapter III of Scale of rates.

3. Accordingly, the bagged cargoes will be permitted to be stored at the above mentioned notified areas for an initial period of 30 days and further permission for extension shall be granted on a monthly basis for a maximum period upto 90 days from the date of initial allotment, subject to availability of storage areas on receipt of applications from the CHAs/importers prior to effecting clearance of cargoes from Mumbai Port.
4. You are requested to give wide publicity amongst your members to avail of the facility.
